The Historical Society is pleased to have finally been able to hold live programs. In September Bron Robinson gave an interesting program about Robinson Contracting which has been in business for over 50 years. Phil Jordan joined us in October for an entertaining program about his work with police agencies over the years. Thank you to all of you who purchased tickets for the cardinal raffle. The winning ticket was drawn on December 6, by Todd Trencansky from the Tioga State Bank. Ginny Dawson of Candor won the life-like cardinal hand-carved by Candor's renowned woodcarver, Roger Westgate. (see pictures on following pages).

Our History Center is an amazing place, filled with all kinds of treasures including bricks from the Candor Brick Factory, bottles from the High View Dairy, and gloves from the Candor Glove Company. The Center contains a small museum, but the main focus is research. There are millions of news articles on people and places in Candor, photographs, family files, and old documents, etc. for you to use in your genealogical or general research. The Center is staffed on Monday mornings from 9 a.m. to noon, but you can arrange to come at a different time by calling Nancy Riggs at 607-759-4001, or Georgia Westgate at 607-659-7769.

We have owned the History Center for almost four years and have managed to do some upgrades to the old building, most recently adding a new front porch and sidewalks. We are hopeful that a new handicapped accessible bathroom will be in place by next summer. Since we don't raise much money with our dues, we rely mostly on donations and grants for renovations. Carol Henry is constantly submitting grant proposals, and so far, we have gotten a few. We need many more, however, as the whole building needs insulation and new siding and windows. If you would like to donate to the renovation fund, you can send a check to the Candor Historical Society, P.O. Box 585, Candor, NY 13743. The money goes through the PayPal Giving Fund directly to us with no added fees. Another place to donate is the Neighborhood Redemption Center in Owego. Take your empty cans and bottles there and tell them it is for the Candor Historical Society. If you can't make it there, you can bring your bagged cans and bottles to Candor Home Central, and place them in the bin there.

We are hoping to sell the Catatonk Hall which was given to us in 2000, and used primarily for storage. Since we now own the History Center, a much better building for our purposes, we no longer need the Catatonk Hall. It is listed by Jeri Sarrge of Realty Solutions in Owego if you are interested or know someone who wants an historic building.

We look forward to an exciting year and hope to see you at one of our programs or at the History Center.

### **Candor Historical Society Holds Successful Cardinal Drawing:**

The Candor Historical Society held their Cardinal Raffle drawing on December 6, at the Candor History Center. The entire Board of Directors was on hand for this major event, including a handful of members, World Class

Carver Roger Westgate, and Todd Trencansky from Tioga



State Bank, who drew the winning number. Ginny Dawson, from Candor, although not present, held the lucky ticket.

In an effort to raise money for the History Center's renovation projects, Roger Westgate graciously donated his creative talents by hand carving a Cardinal to be raffled off, with all the proceeds going to the Historical Society. The \$4080.00 raised through this raffle will be added to a previous grant from the Tioga County Senior Foundation, which will allow the Historical Society to complete the indoor, handicapped bathroom project. The Historical Society wishes to thank everyone who participated or pur-

chased a ticket for this event, and to those who have donated in the past, and volunteers who help to sustain the Candor Historical Society.



### Milton Dougherty Receives Kudos as long-standing Candor's Historical Society President

Milton Dougherty, past president of the Candor Historical Society, was presented a plaque of appreciation at the September 29, Historical Society Talk, for his twenty-two years serving as president. Dougherty was one of the initial members of the Candor History Group when it started in 1996. A year later, the Candor Historical Society was formed, and he was elected to serve as the first Secretary, and served in that capacity until June 1999, when he was elected President. During his role as President, Dougherty diligently fulfilled the stated purpose of the Society—"to bring together those people interested in the history of the Town of Can-

dor ... to discover and collect material which may help to establish or illustrate the history of the area." As President of the Candor Historical Society, Dougherty was very active initiating the recording of personal stories of people who had a long history in the Town of Candor. Despite all odds, Dougherty's accomplishments have been many. With the help of the Board and Historical Society members he's been able to keep the Candor Historical Society front and center in the community. Initiating a mailing of a newsletter twice a year, which contains a President's Message, as well as participating in various community events such as the 4th of July Parade and Candor Fall Festival. Major accomplishments include obtaining title to the Catatonk Hall and more recently to the Candor Grange Hall (now the Candor History Center), finding matching concrete blocks to repair the wall damage to the Catatonk Hall, and obtaining a contractor and volunteer help to make the Grange Hall usable as a History Center.
