HISTORY CENTER RENOVATION FUND-RAISING UPDATE

Since we have not been able to hold any of our fundraisers due to Covid, we are asking people for donations to help with the upkeep and renovation project of your History Center. SEEKING GRANTS: We have been actively applying for grants for our history center renovation project, and have been successful in obtain a grant from the Mildred Faulkner Truman Foundation to renovate the front entrance and make it handicap accessible; a grant from Tioga State Bank (see photo, left) to repair the deteriorating chimney; and a grant from the William C. Pomeroy Foundation for New York State History, which helped to purchase technical equipment to aid in research, as well as filing and storage cabinets, and tables for researchers' use. Additional grants are still being pursued.

Our CAN AND BOTTLE DRIVE is ongoing, active and has been a great source of income! An account
